**Foundation for The Cancer Institute of New Jersey Presents New Leadership**  
*Prominent Business Leader and Four-Time Cancer Survivor Named Chair of Board of Trustees*

**New Brunswick, N.J., August 11, 2009** – The Cancer Institute of New Jersey (CINJ) Foundation has named Subha V. Barry of Princeton, a global leader in the business community and four-time cancer survivor, as Chair of its Board of Trustees. The CINJ Foundation is a non-profit, 501C-3 organization devoted to raising funds to support CINJ, which is a Center of Excellence of UMDNJ-Robert Wood Johnson Medical School. CINJ is New Jersey’s only National Cancer Institute-designated Comprehensive Cancer Center, an elite distinction held by only 40 centers in the country.

Recently retired from Bank of America Merrill Lynch after a 20-year tenure, Ms. Barry served as managing director and global head of Diversity and Inclusion for Merrill Lynch & Co., Inc. She holds master’s degrees in both Accounting and Business and Public Management from Rice University and is a member of numerous boards and committees including the Corporate Circle Advisory Committee of the National Council for Research on Women. She is an active mentor of women both within her community and across her industry, and was recognized last year by the National Organization for Women as one of its Women of Power and Influence. In addition, as a cancer survivor, Ms. Barry supports and coaches newly-diagnosed patients with coping strategies and methods for achieving a successful work/life balance.

Ms. Barry has served on the CINJ Foundation Board of Trustees since 2005 and is eager to begin her new role. “By embracing the collective wisdom of this Board, we have an opportunity to educate a broad community about the importance of philanthropic support and how that support translates into cutting-edge research and advanced treatment here at CINJ,” she said. “It is my privilege to serve in this position alongside so many who are dedicated to the CINJ mission.”

In addition to the elevation of Ms. Barry to the role of Chair, the CINJ Foundation announces the selection of Princeton resident Duncan MacMillan as Vice Chair. Mr. MacMillan is the retired co-founder of Bloomberg, LP.

Former CINJ Director William N. Hait, MD, PhD, of Princeton will once again serve as President of the Board. Dr. Hait is Senior Vice President and Head of Worldwide Hematology/Oncology Research and Development at Johnson & Johnson.
