### **Six Year Old Princeton Girl Makes Donation to Honor Her Father**

**New Brunswick, New Jersey, February 27, 2007** – Annie Hait [Princeton] has grown up at The Cancer Institute of New Jersey (CINJ). As the youngest daughter of Dr. William Hait, CINJ's Director and Sung Hait, she has witnessed the remarkable things her father has accomplished first hand. To honor her father and to thank him for all he has done for cancer patients in New Jersey and around the world, Annie recently made a donation to The Cancer Institute of New Jersey Foundation.

Dr. Hait will step down as Director of CINJ on February 28, 2007 to lead Johnson & Johnson's Hematology/Oncology Research and Development organization. Under his leadership, The Cancer Institute of New Jersey successfully earned cancer center designation from the National Cancer Institute in 1997. In 2002, it received the National Cancer Institute's highest designation to become the 39th Comprehensive Cancer Center in the United States. CINJ is the state's first and only National Cancer Institute-designated Comprehensive Cancer Center and just one of three in the New York metropolitan area.

"We are so proud of Annie and her desire to give back to the institution her father called home for fourteen years," stated Annie's mom Sung Hait. "It was Annie's idea to honor her dad with a donation to the CINJ Foundation to help fund the cutting edge research at CINJ."
