Healthy male volunteers needed

Researchers at **The Cancer Institute of New Jersey (CINJ)** are studying the role of the mineral selenium in reducing one's risk for prostate cancer. Consider taking part in this study...and join the team!

- CINJ researchers are trying to see if selenium yeast or selenomethionine lower prostate-specific antigen (PSA) levels and prevent other markers related to the development of prostate cancer in healthy men of different age groups.
- Participants will be asked to take over-the-counter selenium supplements or a placebo for twelve months.
- Five visits to CINJ are required during the study, where blood and urine samples will be taken.
- Compensation is provided.

You may be eligible to participate if you:

- Are a healthy male between 20 and 79 years of age
- Have no evidence of prostate cancer
- Are a nonsmoker
- Can visit CINJ five times over twelve months.
