Speakers

Harold J. Burstein, MD, PhD is an assistant professor of medicine at Harvard Medical School and a medical oncologist in the Breast Oncology Center at Dana-Farber Cancer Institute. He graduated from Harvard University before earning his MD at Harvard Medical School. Burstein also received a PhD in cellular immunology and a master's degree in history of science from Harvard. He trained in internal medicine at Massachusetts General Hospital before his oncology fellowship at Dana Farber Cancer Institute. In 1999, he joined Dana Farber Cancer Institute and Brigham & Women's Hospital, where he is a clinician and clinical investigator with a practice devoted exclusively to breast cancer. He is board certified in medical oncology and internal medicine. Burstein serves on the National Comprehensive Cancer Network Breast Cancer Panel, the CALGB Breast Committee, and several working groups in the American Society of Clinical Oncology focusing on breast cancer.

Helen A. Pass, MD, FACS is Co-Director,

Women's Breast Center and Chief of Breast Surgery at Stamford Hospital. She graduated from the University of Michigan School of Medicine in Ann Arbor. She performed her general surgery residency at the University of Texas Health Science Center, in Houston and



at Georgetown University Hospital in Washington, DC. She completed a surgical oncology fellowship, as well as served as a Senior Investigator at the Surgery Branch of the National Cancer Institute, National Institutes of Health. She is certified by the American Board of Surgery and limits her practice to surgical diseases of the breast. Dr. Pass is a Governor of the American College of Surgeons and sits on the Executive Committee of the Commission on Cancer. She is a Past President and former Chairman of the Board of the American Society of Breast Surgeons. She has been instrumental in the creation of the multidisciplinary Breast Fellowship, and served on the Training Committee of the Society of Surgical Oncology and the Breast Specialty Training Committee of the American Society of Breast Diseases. She is also a founding member and past member of the Executive Committee of the National Accreditation Program for Breast Centers.
